Spectacular Fall at QWL



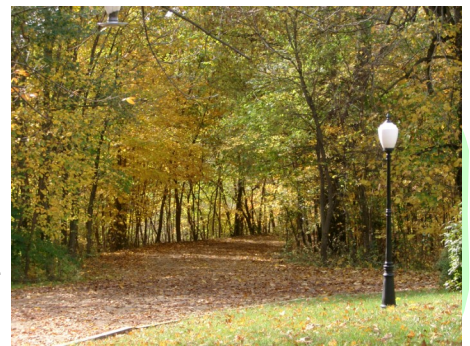
Northeastern Iowa is known for the beautiful display of the changing of the leaves in Fall. Here at Quiet Walker Lodge, the forest reserve becomes an array of brilliant reds, yellows and oranges as the trees begin to prepare for winter.

October is our busiest month and many people reserve suites at the lodge and take trips along the Mississippi River to enjoy the colors of the trees.

The Heritage Trail is only a few minutes from the lodge and is one of Iowa's first-rate rail trails. It winds its way through the rugged, forested bluff country of the Mississippi River valley from Dubuque on into the prairie ridges to the west. This 26 mile trail is made of packed dirt, gravel,

and crushed-limestone. The trail is one of the most popular in Iowa especially during the autumn color show.

If you enjoy nature and a peaceful getaway where you can enjoy a relaxing time away from the stress of everyday life, consider staying at QWL during October.
